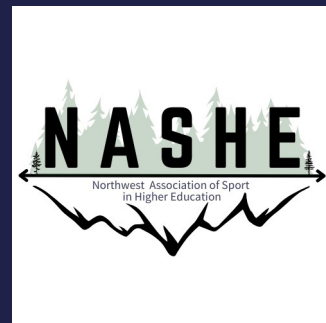

## **Research Symposium: 9:00 AM – Noon**

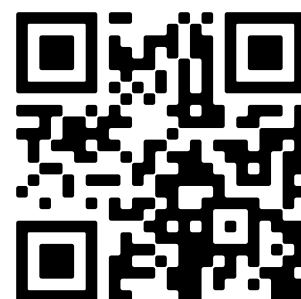
- Knowledge-sharing among scholars and students in sport studies.

## Call for Abstracts

### Northwest Association of Sport in Higher Education Research Symposium

The main objective of the symposium is to give scholars and students in sport studies who are based in the Northwest an opportunity to share their research, create new contacts and stimulate collaboration.

We welcome submissions from scholars and students conducting research in the fields of sport management, sport administration, sport coaching, recreation/outdoor management, and other related fields in sport studies, including but not limited to studies on management, leadership, marketing, finance, sponsorship, communication, media, law and compliance, policy, sociology, ethics, diversity and inclusion, Title IX, governance, operations, tourism, ecology and environment, sustainability, innovation, public health and physical activity, career and professional development, education, pedagogy, and psychology as they pertain to sport.

Aspiring presenters can propose presentations of completed studies, conceptual work, studies in progress, and summaries of personal research agendas and publications.

Participants can submit abstracts for oral presentations or posters. Accepted oral presentations will be allocated at least 10 minutes per presentation (more if schedule and number of presenters allow), followed by Q&A and discussion.

Abstracts should be limited to 300 words (excluding title, author information, and references). Please organize the abstract according to APA 7th edition. Please include up to five keywords. Download the abstract template [\*\*here\*\*](#).

The priority deadline for submissions is March 15. Proposals submitted after this date will be considered based on space availability. Presenters will be notified about their acceptance by March 25.
